Here are some helpful suggestions to aid you in your reading:

1. Try to pray before you begin asking the Holy Spirit to give you understanding and insight into the Scriptures! When a thought comes to mind “out of nowhere”, it came from Him; Be sure to tell Him thanks!
2. If time permits, read each chapter twice; it will help you to see things that a single reading might miss
3. Take note of repeated words or phrases; these are normally important.
4. Take note of what the Holy Spirit is impressing upon your mind and heart.
5. If something confuses you, you can research it on your own or simply write it down on your worksheet;

The Goal
